I've spent a lot of time in Ireland seeing family and friends and I admit Monaghan isn't the first place I'd think of to visit. But just you wait until you're bounding along those country roads, skirting around the county's famous Drumlins — small, dumping-like hills surrounded by wetlands and loughs — and passing through idyllic and loughs - and passing through idyllic market towns.

It's obvious that Monaghan still has that loveable 'land that time forgot' charm that much of Ireland seems to be actively trying to lose. Packing up the car and setting off into Efac

uncharted territory was just the kind of Irish adventure I loved kind of Irish adventure I loved as a kid and one that I unashamedly enjoyed as an adult. What's more, a stay here is cheap as chips and one that the whole family will love.

We based ourselves in Clones, which is a short drive from everything worth seeing. We stayed in the centre of town at the cosy Creighton Hotel, a prime spot on the main drag with a fantastic value-formoney restaurant and locals' bar.
